TREATMENT APPROACH

- Earlier access to a multi-disciplinary mental health team who will:
 - Provide an assessment by a clinical psychologist and a psychiatrist, resulting in treatment and medication recommendations
 - Deliver treatment face to face through regional sites across Ontario or virtually, using secure videoconferencing and teleconferencing technology
- Support of a personal Care Navigator (Occupational Therapist) who will:
 - Coordinate the plan member's care across all treatment providers to encourage better understanding, continuity and collaboration of care
 - Provide coaching and support to help the plan member achieve set goals in partnership with Manulife
 - Communicate with the plan member, their doctor and Manulife, to keep everyone informed and engaged
 - In partnership with Manulife, help the plan member develop a return to work plan and identify the need for work accommodations

Expected key outcomes of the pilot

FOR MEMBERS

1. Earlier access to personalized treatment specific to their needs
2. Advocacy and support from a Care Navigator to support return to health
3. Helpful, relevant information about their condition and how they can improve their health
4. Safe recovery and sustainable return to work

FOR SPONSORS

1. Shorter absence duration for employees; and an earlier and more sustainable return to work
2. Potentially reduced backfill costs and disruption to the workplace
3. Better likelihood of the employee's recovery with the support of a collaborative care team including the Care Navigator
